RM of St. Andrews – possible Infrastructure Assistance Grant to help with the cost of the new sewer system being installed– would have to pay up front and then they would reimburse

There are grants on United Church website and could receive \$5,000 max. it would also be matching. It will cost between \$8,000 to \$10,000 when the line is put in and will have two months once it's install to pay this. The line will be installed by next fall. Could pay in a lump sum or over 20 years on tax bill.
