Red River Churches Refugee Team

Little Britain has been a member of the Red River Churches Refugee Team (RRCRT) since shortly after its inception in March 2016. To date, three families have been sponsored, two of whom are related and came together from the Sudan via a refugee camp in Chad in July 2016. The other family was a single mom with two children from Syria who arrived in 2018 and then relocated the following year to Ottawa to be with her mother.

In 2018, the RRCRT also committed to sponsoring a family from Pakistan who were in hiding in Thailand. We are currently waiting for the paperwork to be completed in Thailand for this family. When they arrive, there will be significant expenses to support them through their first year in Selkirk. We would appreciate your help for this worthy effort.
