Worship Service News

We will be worshipping **outside** at 10:00 am on **Sunday, July 4**. Please remember to bring a lawn chair, mask, Voices United hymn book, hat, water/coffee, food bank and soup kitchen donations. The hall is open for the washroom, but the drinking water has not been tested.

If weather conditions are not suitable for an outdoor service, you will receive an email with Zoom information by 9:00 am on that day.

The current Provincial Public Health Orders, in effect until August 2, 2021, allow outdoor religious service gatherings for up to 50 persons. Drive-in services are also allowed if you are interested in listening to the worship service on July 4 while remaining in your car.

Indoor religious gatherings are currently limited to a 25 percent capacity and masks must be worn at all times. Little Britain will continue to use Zoom for worship services over the summer and will plan to begin indoor services in September.
