Little Britain United Church was successful in receiving the Manitoba Heritage Resources Conservation Grant of \$22,360 as a contribution towards half of the roof restoration costs.

The church also received \$20,000 in Bridge Grant funding from the provincial government to help alleviate financial pressures. This assistance was provided to eligible businesses and organizations that were required to fully close their premises to the public as a result of Manitoba COVID-19 Prevention Orders.
