**The journey of Lent** - Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which falls 40 days prior to Easter. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which falls 40 days prior to Easter. Sundays are not included in the count of these days, as each Sunday is a "little Easter", meant to celebrate resurrection.

The name Lent comes through Middle English and Old English (lengten), referring to the season of spring and the lengthening of days. It is also related to the French (lente), which means to "move slowly." The colour of Lent is purple reflecting divinity, wisdom, dignity, mystery. Purple is a penitential colour, evoking sadness and deep reflection.

As we enter into this time of Lent, we are asked to think deeply about those things that distract us from God and one another and to discern how we share our resources for God's mission. Lent is the beginning of a wonderful journey into who we are and how we express our faith. The journey of Lent has all of the possibilities of drawing us closer to God.
